Grammar: separable verbs, perfect tense with "sein und haben", Präteritum of "sein und haben", temporal and local prepositions, verbs with dative, possessive in nominative and accusative, imperative, modal verbs, adjective (comparisons and comparatives), connectors, ordinal numbers, date, subjunctive II, sentence structure.

Students can introduce themselves and talk and write about their families, interests and hobbies. They can hold small conversations, ask and answer questions, make dates, ask what time it is, talk about their eating habits and order at restaurants
